

Her first novel *The Moon in the Water* was long-listed for the first ever Man Asia Literary Prize and was published in January 2009. She has edited *Blue-Stories for Adults* which is Sri Lanka's first ever book of modern erotic stories, published in January 2011.

Mahboobullah Khan is the Editor-in-Chief of 'Kisa Digest' magazine and is Program Manager of 'Shpoon' production. A young writer and poet of Afghanistan, he has worked as translator and announcer with All India Radio in Delhi for a year.

Shehpar Rasool is a renowned Academician, poet and critic of India. He was born in 1956. He has written extensively on Urdu poetry and his articles have been published in various national and international journals of repute. He has a number of books to his

GURCHARAN SINGH CHANI (India)

A graduate of National School of Drama, Gurcharan Singh Chani has been a Fulbright Fellow at Boston University and a teacher at Film and TV Institute of India, Pune. Community Theatre by Sangeet Natak Akademi, 2000. He has produced and directed many award winning telefilms and documentaries. His latest work is a 26 part documentary series on the Forts of India.

SHABNAM RIAZ (India)



Shabnam Riaz works as a television News Anchor for the National Television network: PTV news. In July 2006 she was given the National Award for Best English News Reader, 2003-2005. She also works as a freelance writer contributing to many leading newspapers like 'Dawn'. She has been

writing for the Op-ed pages for The News. She has written extensively on subjects relating to social concerns, current affairs, health and cultural issues. She is the author of 'The Whispering Wind', which is her first book of Poems. Her volume, 'Twinkling Tunes', was awarded a prize for "Children Literature" held by The National Book Foundation for her book of

have been published and won awards.

BIMAL GUHA (Bangladesh)

Bimal Guha, the poet, was born on 27 October 1952 at Bajalia Village of Chittagong District. He is the eldest son of Prasanna Kumar Guha and Manadabala Guha. Bimal had his early education in local school and college, and later in universities at home and abroad. He had his PhD in modern Bengali poetry from



the University of Dhaka. He entered the literary arena in 1968 while a school student and is still continuing his literary activities. His first book of poems Ahongkar, Tomar Shabdo was published in 1982 and he has published as many as 21 books to his credit including 13 books of poems. A leading poet of his generation, Bimal Guha's poems are about the problems of our time, more particularly about the difficulties of adjectment that a feeling and thinking individual faces in an increasingly alienating world. He demonstrates, in his poems, great adroitness in the use of simile and imagery. He has developed expression of art to arrest time and space into a newer vision. He was awarded Bangladesh Parishad National Literary Award for poetry in 1979 by the Government of Bangladesh; National Literary Award for poetry in 1979 by Kingbadontir Amra, Dhaka. He is also a *Poet-Celebrity* of the Bangladesh Writers Club, Dhaka in 2002. Dr Guha now heads an administrative office of the University of Dhaka.

NIRMAL KANTI BHATTACHARJEE (India)



Nirmal Kanti Bhattacharjee, a former Director of the National Book Trust, is regular contributor of articles and reviews in various newspapers including The Statesman. He led a Delegation of Indian Writers to Moscow during the Festival of India in Russia. Born at Silchar (Assam) in

1947 Nirmal did his M.A. in English Literature with a Post-Graduate certificate in English and taught English Literature at a Gauhati University College till 1985. He served on panels of many national and international bodies. Returned to the Sahitya Akademi in 2002 he is currently Editor, Indian Literature, a bimonthly journal.

MAHBOUBA IBRAHIMI (Afghanistan)

Mahbouba Ibrahimi, was born in 1976 in Wardak

province. She migrated to Iran during the war in Afghanistan in 1980. She has worked as an editor for different Afghani journals and publishing house. She graduated from Tehran University. She is the author of a collection of poems, "Winds are my Sisters" in 2006.



LAKSHMI KANNAN (India)

Lakshmi Kannan is a bi-lingual writer who writes in English and in Tamil. She uses the pen-name of 'Kaaveri' for her writings in Tamil. A poet, novelist, short story writer and translator, she has published twenty books till date that include four collections of poems in English, several books of fiction in English translation as well as her original works in Tamil. Penguin, Bharatiya Jnanpith and K.K.Birla Foundation, Delhi have published three collections of her novellas and short stories in Hindi translation.

Lakshmi was the Indian participant in the International Writing Program at Iowa (USA); a Writer-in-Residence at the University of Canterbury at Kent, (U.K.), a

British Council Visitor to the University of Cambridge, U.K., a Fellow of the Indian Institute of Advanced Study at Shimla and a Sahitya Akademi Writer-in-Residence attached to the English department of Jamia Millia Islamia University, Delhi.

She has given readings and talks in many national and international seminars at home and overseas and has extensively published critical essays on gender sensitivity, on retrograde practices on women in the name of religion and custom, on translation and on the politics of `regional' and `national' literature. She is based in Delhi.
